# **Early Literacy Grant**

Supports early literacy for children birth to age 8 by giving books to children and their families.

More than 100K books distributed since 2002.

Partners: local publishers, ABDO and Capstone.

Opens in winter 2025







# Early Literacy Grant

500 books to Byron Public Schools.

"The books are used to design a class for the littlest people in our community. The teacher prepares a class filled with fun activities like songs, fingerplays and art crafts related to the theme of the book. At the end of the story time class, families take a copy of the book home."

## Early Care and Education Grant

Supports programming to address needs of young children that focus on quality care and education.

More than 7,190 children supported in latest round.

Opens in fall 2024.








## Early Care and Education Grant

\$20K Grant to Kasson-Mantorville Community Education

"Tyler has 1p36 Deletion Syndrome which affects his gross and fine motor skills. He needs assistance walking over uneven surfaces, like the woodchips previously found on our playgrounds. Now that we have a smooth surface outside, kids like Tyler can play and explore with his peers while also feeling more autonomous and confident moving around on a more solid surface."

## **Economic Development Grant**



Supports initiatives which grow community economic development and entrepreneurship initiatives.

Opens in fall 2025 (alternates annually with IEC Grant).





## **Economic Development Grant**



\$10K Grant to Fairmont EDA to create a positive community campaign.

Repurposed Chamber website to serve as a Brain Gain attraction tool.





# Inclusive and Equitable Communities Grant



The Village Agricultural Cooperative in Rochester

Supports projects which grow racial diversity, equity and inclusion opportunities with a focus on entrepreneurship.

Opens in fall 2024 (alternates annually with Economic Development Grant).

# Inclusive and Equitable Communities Grant



The Rice County Neighbors United of Northfield will be using the grant to grow the Mercado Local, a community nonprofit of 20 immigrant vendors.

The grant will support the emerging entrepreneurs, most of whom are women, to continue their business growth. The Mercado Local storefront officially opened in downtown Northfield in December.





## **Small Town Grant**

113 communities supported through Small Town grant. Supports projects in communities under 10,000.

Tourism marketing, welcoming initiatives, community planning, etc. Projects that impact the culture, education, economy, social aspects of the town.

## **Small Town Grant**

\$7,395 grant to Stewartville
Public Library to update a room
to accommodate virtual
meetings and test proctoring.

"This project will provide the only publicly available virtual meeting space in the Stewartville community, as well as the only private, quiet place for a test to be proctored for free in the greater Rochester area."







### Paint the Town Grant

For community murals, welcome signs, historic structures, public art/creative placemaking.

10,700 gallons of paint distributed since 1997.

Up to 100 gallons per project.

For communities under 10,000.

### Paint the Town Grant

The City of Elmore wanted to be inclusive in their Paint the Town project.

A mural was designed to have many of the images low to the ground, allowing everyone to help with the paint-by-number design. Participants, ages 18 months to 80 years, came together, sitting on lawn chairs or even the grass, to create a masterpiece the whole town is proud of.

## **NEW: Community Responsive Grants**

Partner: Otto Bremer Trust

For organizations to address immediate challenges in their communities.

\$10K - \$50K Grants

Community asset building (community planning, diversity initiatives, small business development) or Health and Wellbeing (focus on early childhood)

Highly competitive

Due April 17





### **NEW: PROMISE Act Grants**

Partner: MN DEED

For eligible businesses (and nonprofits that operate like a business)

\$10K - \$50K Grants

Program requirements on website

Highly competitive – not all eligible businesses will receive grants.

Due April 24
