Since creation by the Minnesota Legislature in 1997, three bedrock principles guide our work:


- Community-University partnership

Building sustainability partnerships in 5 Greater Minnesota regions



The Regional Sustainable Development Partnerships (RSDP) connect Greater Minnesota communities to University of Minnesota resources through sustainability projects. RSDP brings together local talent and innovation with University knowledge and resources. Projects are supported through 5 community-driven regional boards and statewide focus area staff.

 - Discussion about ideas can start anytime!




Call for Ideas details

- Municipalities, Non-profits, Businesses and Individuals eligible to apply
- Sustainability project ideas across 4 focus areas; not available in metro
- Regional funding and regionally-specific decision-making
- Connection to/collaboration with UMN is a cornerstone






Historically Significant Opportunity for Small Communities

Available public and private funding could be transformative for Minnesota's small communities.

- · Federal Infrastructure Investment and Job Act (IIJA)
- · Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)
- Additional State programs (LCCMR, MDA, MNDoT, DEED, etc.)
- · Foundations (regional, statewide, and local)




Empowering Small Minnesota Communities is a community-centered collaboration with UMN partners

Why? To strengthen small communities through the development of resilient infrastructure.


Partnerships to...

- Develop or strengthen projects & plans to pursue long-term goals
- Lay groundwork for competitive proposals eligible for a wide a range of funding opportunities
- Be well positioned to benefit from federal, local, and state investments



ESMC Eligibility Requirements

- Priority: communities of 5,000 or fewer. Communities with populations of 15,000 or fewer are eligible to apply.
- Multiple communities can collaborate on a single proposal, all of which must have populations of 15,000 or fewer
- Government entities, tribal nations, non-profits, and community groups can apply





Short projects with a quick turnaround providing technical assistance to produce specific small-scale products requested by communities.

- Committed UMN researcher provides 10-20 hours to develop products under the leadership of the community partner
- Examples: GIS maps, survey writing, data analysis, and more






